Building Manager – New Entrant to the Industry

ABMA NEW ENTRANT PROGRAM

First time purchasers of Management Rights and/or new facilities managers seeking to deliver outcomes in building management services roles are now able to fast track their entry level competency through Australian Building Management Accreditation.

For individuals with less than 2 years' relevant work experience and no approved tertiary qualification seeking to provide evidence of competency to prospective employers, ABMA Industry Practitioner Accreditation – *Building Manager (Provisional)* and the **ABMA New Entrant Program** will communicate to the industry that you have been able to demonstrate an "entry level" of skill

along with a commitment to continuing professional development that will build the capability required of the following roles: -

- Facilities Manager
- Resident Unit Manager
- Caretaker
- Building Manager

Successful completion of the **ABMA New Entrant Program** enables the individual to apply for ABMA Industry Practitioner Accreditation – *Building Manager (Provisional)*, which is available to developing building managers who are undertaking a path of training toward full qualification.

WHAT DOES THE ABMA NEW ENTRANT PROGRAM INCLUDE?

The **ABMA New Entrant Program** has been developed to support "entry level" capability in new or inexperienced managers. Applicants must provide evidence of membership with an approved industry association (e.g. APMA or ARAMA). The **ABMA New Entrant Program** includes: - Subscription to the **ABMA Building Management Code**©; completion of the **ABMA Certificate of Building Management**; completion of the **ABMA Code Application & Code of Conduct training**; AND completion of an **In-Practice Skills Assessment & Level 1 Training**. COST per person - \$1,690.00+GST.

WHO DELIVERS THE ABMA NEW ENTRANT PROGRAM TRAINING & ASSESSMENT?

Applications for entry into the **ABMA New Entrant Program** will be accepted from any individual that can prove current membership with an approved industry association. The ABMA will assess the application and provide a register of ABMA Accredited trainers for delivery of the training and assessment programs, which must be completed by the nominated due date, which is generally within three (3) months of application. Successful completion will be verified via the **ABMA New Entrants Program Completion Certificate**, as well as certification of ABMA Industry Practitioner Accreditation – *Building Manager (Provisional)*

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GAINING A QUALIFICATION WITH ABMA

Industry Practitioners seeking to gain recognition of skills and become Accredited with Australian Building Management Accreditation must be able to demonstrate the following: -

ABMA Building Manager – Full Accreditation

- 5 years' minimum experience as a Senior Facilities Manager, Strata Manager or the owner of Management Rights; OR
- Diploma of Facilities Management; OR
- Diploma of Building Management; PLUS
- Completion of annual ABMA Building Management Code Training course (1/2 day)
- Industry Association Membership
- Subscription to ABMA Building Management Code©

ABMA Building Manager – Provisional Accreditation

- Less than 2 years previous experience
- Completion of ABMA Certificate of Building Management;
- Completion of "In-Practice" basic skills development training (Level 1 Skills)
- Enrolment in continuing training program/s;
- Completion of annual ABMA Code Application & Code of Conduct training;
- Industry Association Membership
- Subscription to ABMA Bdg Mgmt Code©

ABMA Building Manager – Restricted Accreditation

- Office Bearer role for a strata scheme with an ABMA Building Management Plan in place; OR
- Strata Manager role for an organisation that supports self-managed schemes in delivering outcomes under the ABMA Building Management Plan;
- Completion of annual ABMA Building Management Code Training course (1/2 day);
- Completion of annual ABMA Building Management Plan induction training (1/2 day);
- Industry Association Membership
- Subscription to the ABMA Bdg Mgmt Code©
